# Chairman's Column

Firstly, if I haven't already seen you in the forest, a Happy New Year to you all.

Traditionally at the beginning of a new year we often set ourself goals for the year in the form of New Year Resolutions. Some of my goals for the club this year were set out in this column in the previous Waffle and we have already made good progress in a number of them.

Led by Lynn Branford, we have driven forward in our aim to achieve the Clubmark award. Any sports club working with juniors and liaising with schools is being encouraged to adopt the Clubmark scheme and there are signs that shortly some local authorities will not allow schools to work with any clubs which do not have Clubmark. Wimborne Orienteers are fortunate in having a large number of qualified coaches, we have now attended the necessary administrative courses and we hope to be able to qualify for the award sometime in 2007.

We are also liaising with our other local orienteering clubs in co-ordinating such things as junior coaching and training, and in such things as local fixtures. This year, for example, we have been able to use SOC local events for the Dorset Schools League.

Later this year we will be heavily involved, along with our neighbours Sarum, in the British Schools Orienteering Championships. Again, progress has been made recently. Chris Branford has been appointed the event co-ordinator, permissions have been gained for all the areas we wish to use, a joint steering committee has been established between ourselves and Sarum, and by the time you read this, most of the major officials will have been appointed. Please put the weekend of November 17/18 in your new diaries now. This is a major event, with an anticipated attendance of perhaps 1000 or more children, and we will be needing lots of assistance on both days.

Major events bring their own problems and our forthcoming Regional event at Ibsley Common was in doubt until we found a suitable parking area. After much head scratching and lots of lateral thinking by the organiser, Kirsty Staunton, a solution was found. Bussing competitors to events is common in other regions, but not something we have often contemplated in the past. It is, however, the solution for the Ibsley event and may well become common practice for major events in our area in the future.

Finally, if you are going to the JK this Easter, I hope you will be able to find the time on at least one of the days, to assist the WIM team organising the Trail-O events. You can read more about this elsewhere in Waffle.

#### Wimborne Orienteers Founders Trophy

Ron Wilton founded Wimborne Orienteers in 1969, and when Ron died last year the Committee agreed that a Founders Trophy should be awarded annually in his memory. It was decided that the Founders Trophy would be awarded to the fastest (age adjusted) performance at the November Classic, using the BOF speed ratios for the age adjustments. The competition is open to all club members junior or senior, but competitors must run on their eligible course, and short courses are not eligible. Congratulations to Sue Hands who will be awarded the Trophy for her performance at the 2006 November Classic. A full list of results for the 2006 competition is on the web site.

Apologies to those competitors who had already entered the 2006 Classic before we gave notice of the competition, and details of eligible courses. Sue Hands was a clear winner and was actually faster than any of the ineligible juniors or short course competitors. However the short course speeds are shown on the web site to encourage some of those junior or senior members to run their eligible course in 2007. The competition will be held with the November Classic and eligible course details will be published in the September waffle and on the web site as a reminder before you enter.

- For the *L* and *A* courses the score is the percentage compared to the speed of the winner.
- *S* and *B* courses the score is the percentage compared to the faster of the winner of the *Short/B* course and the winner of the equivalent *Long/A* course.
- Junior badge courses are treated individually, without the separation of competitors of different ages.
- Juniors running colour coded courses at regional events will have their results transferred to the corresponding age group classes.

#### AROUND ALDERSHOT RACE - SATURDAY 30 DECEMBER 2006

Having attempted the around Aldershot long mountain bike race last year and failed to finish Madeleine and I decided this year that the short race of just 18.4K would be the one to do. We were to be joined by Peter Fale and another of our regular mountain biking friends, Grahame Austin. However on Wednesday 28 December both Madeleine and I went down with the chesty cough virus so much so that Madeleine decided that she would not be able to compete but as my cough was not quite so bad I felt able to go.

Peter Fale therefore arrived at my house at 8 am his car having a device to carry 3 bicycles and so we loaded up and set off. As Madeleine was not joining us it was soon decided that we 3 'boys' would not do the short race but go for the long of 28.6K. We arrived at Aldershot at 9.30 am with the first start time being 10.30 am. Being organised by BAOC they had Registration, Start and Finish in the athletics stadium with tartan track, main stadium offices for Registration and Download including hot and cold drinks plus very welcome showers when we finished.

So having registered and changed to the long course we prepared to set off at 10.30 am in dry and bright conditions which after the wet and windy weather of the day before was definitely a bonus. This year's race was so much better in that we set off from the centre of Aldershot with the course being a figure of eight passing the stadium after the first 18.4K which was also the short course.

We were soon out of the town on a network of paths and straight into Mytchett which was contoured but most of the tracks easy to ride. 8 controls on Mytchett and then we moved onto Ash Ranges where it was much more exposed and not so easy riding some of the tracks being very

wet and muddy. We left this area through the actual ranges where we have parked for 'O' events and so it was back through the footpaths of the town to the stadium and then along the canal footpath to take us to Long Valley.

By this time the weather was on the change and as we picked up our second control on Long Valley the rain started. Long Valley is very sandy and the large gravel tracks are undulating and were full of water from the day before. By now we were getting tired and with the rain these last few controls seem to take an age. However we eventually get back into town and just 400 metres from the Stadium Grahame gets a puncture in his back tyre. With the rain now lashing down we eventually download to find we have taken 4 hours 24 minutes exactly twice the time of the winner who took 2 hours 12 minutes. All I can say is that we went round together, we thoroughly enjoyed the day, we kept going all the time, it partially cured my cough but we obviously need a bit more training before next year. However after loading the bikes back on the car in the rain the hot showers were fantastic and we are already looking forward to next year's event.

In addition to the two mountain bike courses there were also long and short foot 'O' courses being 18.4K and 10.5K respectively. Our thanks go to Alan Farrington the organiser and Dave Rollins the planner.

#### JK Trail-O, April 7-8

As you will know by now, this year's JK is mainly in the Forest of Dean with SWOA responsible for Friday to Sunday's events and SCOA doing the relays in S Wales on the Monday. As a club, WIM have undertaken to provide the manpower to run the Trail-O events and the editor of Waffle has asked me to explain what this might entail.

I have undertaken to plan the courses for both days, assisted by Keith Henderson. We will need help in setting out the controls, as well as helpers to man registration, the Start/Finish and the timed controls. The intention is that everyone who wishes to will be able to run their own Foot-O courses, although possibly with either an early or late start. We can re-arrange these nearer the date of the event, meanwhile if you are running, go ahead and enter as usual

On the Saturday, the Trail-O event is in Nine Wells Plantation, next to the Royal Forest of Dean College, which is also being used as one of the main car parks for the whole event, with the Foot-O being on the other side of the main road, with the main start about 10 minutes walk away. The JK finish & Assembly area is also about 10 minutes walk away. We hope to have the use of a classroom for registration/results processing.

On the Sunday, the Trail-O is in the (only) flat part of the Sallowvallets forest used by the Foot -O on the day before. Parking will be on a couple of forest tracks and the administration will run from the club tent. The main JK parking is in a large field next to the Speech House Hotel, about 5-10 minutes away from the Trail-O by car, with the assembly area, finish and most of the starts 5-10 minutes walk from the parking field.

The Trail-O event will operate between 10.30 and about 3.00, with the Elite competitors starting between 10.30 & 12.30 and the Come & Try it course operating between 12.30 & about 2.00. This will allow the orienteering public to do the Trail-O after they have run their JK courses, with those wanting to do the Elite course having an early start with us before going off to run their foot-o course.

Only the Elite Trail-O course has timed controls which means that we will probably need fewer helpers in the afternoon than in the morning.

Once I know which members of the club are going to the JK I will be in touch with you in the hope that you will be able to help at some time over the two days.

#### Winter Warmer, Sunday 18th February 2007

This year's regional event is to be held in the New Forest, on Ibsley Common. Ibsley Common is on the western edge of the New Forest just north of Ringwood. It is a high and exposed plateau surrounded by many tricky re entrants! Ibsley Common is owned by the National Trust and after some delicate negotiations we have permission for events in winter provided that there are no vehicles parked on National Trust land.

Finding a car parking area large enough for this event has been tricky, there are several large fields close to the event area but they are used by horses and livestock which are brought in from the forest during the winter. These fields also looked very wet during the recent rain! We looked further afield and are now going to use the Headland Business Park, it is a small industrial estate with *hard standing* car parking available. It is situated just off the A338, north of Ringwood and 10 mins drive from Ibsley Common. We have permission from most of the business owners to use their car parking places and they have agreed that the car parking fee should be donated to the Teenage Cancer Trust, a registered charity. The registration tent and download will be located at the business park. Competitors will be bussed to the start (+800m walk) and back to the car park. I realise that being transported to and from the event area is not ideal but it was the only solution. Just like all Wims major events we are going to need lots of help from the club members. I have spent the last couple of days making a long list of 'tasks' and I shall be on the phone in the New Year!!! If you fancy trying something new, maybe helping at the start or directing cars and getting a chance to use the 'big yellow hand', or managing the clothing dump – it's in a nice sheltered spot..... then let me know. This year we are asking everyone wanting to run a Badge course to pre-enter via Cris Tween. The closing date is Monday Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>, after which there will be a late entry fee,but Cris will take entries by telephone up to Friday Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> if there are maps available.
