2. Minutes of last AGM:

4. Treasurer's Report

Karen French presented the financial report. The full report is attached as Appendix B, and a summary is below:

19 events gave us revenue, with excellent surplus £4229.91. Much the same as last year, but with fewer events. The club is very solvent: balance £10842.54. Some events made a loss; particularly local events in West Dorset. It is seen as vitally important to continue to host these events and encourage participation. Some of the surplus will be used to support Junior activities.

The biggest items of expenditure were:

Relay entry fees – worth the expenditure, because success is achieved, and it is good to return some of the surplus directly to the members.

The accounts were adopted and signed by Treasurer and Secretary.
